5th SUNDAY OF LENT March 21, 2010

“....SAVE HIS PEOPLE FROM THEIR SINS”

God speaks very plainly about the purpose for which He is sending His Divine Son into the world. When He announced the coming earthly birth of His Son, He said “You are to name Him Jesus, because He will SAVE HIS PEOPLE FROM THEIR SINS.”

The heavenly Father makes it plain, that SIN is a grave issue. Sin must be destroyed. Sin eventually crucified the Babe in Bethlehem. And sin (unforgiven) inflicts everlasting death upon men.

God specifically stresses the horrible reality of sin. Modern man – including a large segment in the Catholic Church – try to play it down. It is the cover-up of many burglar theologians today.

Jesus means Savior. His name proclaimed His mission. Saving was ingrained in His very blood. God said that He will be called Savior (Jesus) BECAUSE He would save people from their sins. Jesus and Sin are opposite poles.

Since the Church represents Jesus through the centuries, there is one thing it must face – and that is Sin. If there is one thing the Church must fight – and overcome – it is sin. Otherwise the Church is a traitor.

The Church and sin must be mortal enemies – just as Jesus and sin were mortal enemies. Sin may not be played down. It must not be allowed to lurk among us as a wolf in sheep’s clothing.

If there is one thing Jesus built into His Church, it was a bomber for pounding sin – relentlessly, mercilessly, and endlessly.

The bomber of sin is the sacrament of confession. Knowing the mission of Christ, confession (penance) becomes an item of first priority in His Church. If sin is the only obstacle that can keep us out of heaven, then confession is a prime necessity in the institution dispensing eternal salvation in the name of Christ.

Through the sacrament of baptism, a soul becomes a son of God, sharing in His divine life. In this act of divine mercy the new Christian acquires the right to positive aid through the Catholic Church’s entire sacramental system, in which Confession (penance) is a healing medicament and tonic. - Father Pokorny
May the faithful respond to this Sacrament, at the feet of the Savior and receive, what is infinitely more important, Absolution –To be Forgiven!

ATTENTION PARISHIONERS
