INDULGENCES FOR THE POOR SOULS

Current regulations enforced by Pope Benedict XVI

On all the days from November 1st through November 8th inclusive, a plenary indulgence, applicable only to the Poor Souls, is granted to those who visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed.

Conditions for both indulgences:

1. Only one plenary indulgence can be gained per day.
2. It is necessary to be in the state of grace, at least by completion of the work.
3. Freedom from attachment to sin, even venial sin, is necessary, otherwise the indulgence is only partial. (By this is meant attachment to a particular sin, not sin in general.)
4. Holy Communion must be received each time the indulgence is sought.
5. Prayers must be recited for the intentions of the Holy Father on each day the indulgence is sought. (No particular prayers are prescribed. One Our Father and one Hail Mary suffice, or other suitable prayers.)
6. A sacramental confession must be made within a week of completion of the prescribed work. (One confession made during the week, made with the intention of gaining all the indulgences suffices.)

Pray for the deceased, so that when they shall have attained Heaven, they will not fail to pray for you... They who are laying, in torments cry out to us daily and few answer them; they utter their mournful plea, and there is none to comfort them. How awful a cruelty! Truly, this is a great inhumanity!

Consider for a moment: if a man lying ill on his bed cries out in pain, his suffering is relieved by the doctor!...a donkey falls, and all hastened to help him up; but a member of the faithful cries out in torments, and none answer his plea!

A BABY BROUGHT TO MASS

A baby brought to Mass develops from Sunday to Sunday (day to day) in this holy atmosphere. As he/she matures he/she becomes familiar with the Sacrifice. The baby is properly oriented. The essence of habit of worship is being implanted in the tiny person—a habit that will stand the child in good stead during the tempestuous years that lie ahead, indeed for a lifetime.

I like you to recommend to young couple receiving marriage instructions that they should when the child arrives, bring it to the Church—to present their baby to the Lord. This aside from the required Baptismal Ceremonies of the newly born infant.

Some time after Baptism, perhaps after a Sunday Mass, when the church is empty (and it's entirely on their own), the parents of the newly baptized should bring their child to the front, close to the Child's Savior present in the Blessed Sacrament. Holding their child in their arms, they should "present him/her to the Lord." Just a simple quiet prayer of offering of the baby to God, as the moment prompts you to offer in your own words.

What a powerful spiritual boost parents like these would confer upon the child in the beginning of their life! Placing the feet of their tiny little one firmly on the "straight and narrow"! God would like that! We often discover parents like these who have consecrated their child, children in this manner, when we read the lives of many of the canonized saints. These saints were fruits of saintly parents!

Presenting a baby to the Lord in this way should really be a commonplace event with Catholic parents. It should be the normal thing to do, the (spiritually) natural thing to do. It would be a most pleasing ritual in the eyes of God. One worthy of special blessings.

As an incentive and an example of such an offering, we recommend consulting the portion of St. Luke's Gospel which records the "Presentation of the Infant Jesus" in the temple (2:22-52). For Mary and Joseph this was the required and "official" ceremony corresponding pretty much to today's official Baptismal Rites. Yet it serves as a basis for voluntary offering which I am suggesting.

There are all sorts of branches which might grow from such "presentation ceremonies". They can be sacred to the parents and the family. Each child could be "re-consecrated" every year during its youthful years. A good day for this would be on the child's birthday; or ever better, its baptismal anniversary.

There should be some way of marking a Baptismal Day even more than celebrating a birthday. This is unfortunately seldom done. There is every reason in the world—and in heaven! To commemorate both the birthday and the baptismal day.

The Sacrament of Baptism and the other Sacraments would take on a fresh new meaning; an appreciation of God's coming to the soul through the Sacraments, would be instilled.

Children would grow more easily and naturally in holiness.

And, by all means, parents would be spontaneously sanctified along with their children. Homes would find peace more easily. The Family would be blessed. Here would be rich ground no doubt for the following of religious vocations and of the spread of purity in society and in the world.

Yes, babies belong in church!

They need planting and rooting in Holy Mass and the Divine Presence!
