POPE BENEDICT PROCLAIMS The True Value of Suffering  
 Pope Benedict reflects on this mystery in his message on the occasion of the 19<sup>th</sup> World Day of the Sick, February 11, 2011, also the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. Suffering, the Pope admits, is often frightening and difficult. No one seeks it. Yet while the Risen Lord “did not take away suffering and evil from the world, he defeated them at their root. To the arrogance of Evil he opposed the omnipotence of his Love” (Pope’s Message for 2011 World Day of the Sick,”1).

How we approach suffering, said the Pope determines who we are. “The true measure of humanity I essentially discovered in relationship to suffering and to the sufferer... both for the individual and the society.” Jesus had compassion on suffering people, healing them in body, mind, and soul. Then, though innocent, Jesus allowed himself to be vanquished by evil and suffering. Quoting from his own writings, Pope Benedict affirms that Jesus’ apparent defeat becomes the “proof of victorious love: Only a God who loves us to the extent of taking upon himself our wounds and our pain, especially innocent suffering is worthy of faith” (**Urbi et Orbi** Message, Easter 2007).

The Pope exhorts us as individuals, then, to recognize Jesus in the suffering. “Create bridges of love and solidarity, so that no one feels alone but near to God and part of the great family of his children.” And to society, he says, quoting his own encyclical, “A society unable to accept its suffering members and incapable of helping to share their suffering and to bear it inwardly through ‘com-compassion’ is a cruel and inhuman society” (**Spe Salvi**, No. 38). able and to be as little bother to others as possible.

The Pope concludes his reflection with the Sacred Heart of Jesus. “Contemplating Jesus’ wounds our gaze turns to his most Sacred Heart in which God’s love manifests itself in the supreme way. The Sacred Heart is Christ crucified, with his side opened by the lance from which blood and water flow, ‘symbol of the sacraments of the Church, that all men, drawn to the Heart of the Savior, might drink from the perennial font of salvation’ (John 19:34, Roman Missal, “Preface for the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Hear of Jesus”).

“With St. Ignatius of Loyola we pray: ‘Water from the side of Christ, wash me. Passion of Christ, strengthen me. O good Jesus, hear me. In your wounds, hide me.’” Amen.
