**Dating Demands Decisions**  
Dating is as important today as it ever was to high school youths. Dating demands decisions and decisions demand wise choices. No matter how small a decision may seem at the time, it can have a major impact on our life and on the lives of others as it unfolds into public view.

Decisions as to whom we date, where we should go and how much time we should spend with any one person are extremely important.

Who? Let's look at the question, “Whom should we date?” So often we judge people by their reputations and their friends. Therefore we should keep in mind that others will judge us by those same standards—by whom we associate.

Reputations are definitely affected by the company we keep. Usually we are attached to others by common interests, such as sports, hobbies, music, etc. If a person in the school band “hangs around” with band members, we can safely assume that music is probably very important to him. We really should consider the interests of any person we intend to date. Having “something in common” will often make our friendship more lasting and enjoyable.

Where? Where to go? It is very important that we give this a lot of serious thought.

We should not take chances and think that we won't be affected by places which can be an occasion of sin. We are obligated to avoid such places and situations.

Generally speaking, dating in group situations is an excellent way to develop good relationships. It also provides a more wholesome, “fun way” to learn more about the likes and dislikes and personalities of different people.

How often? How often should we date?

Well, it is not wise to make any one person the center of all our attention, thoughts and moments. When we do this, we definitely exclude all others and limit our own personality growth and development.

Even more crucial is the fact that “going steady” is for those who are thinking seriously about marriage and this should not be a primary concern of teenagers. Additionally sharing apartments etc. by teenagers, college age youth place themselves in grave danger of intimacy that they are not ready to handle and is not far removed from “exclusive dating”. Exclusive Dating of one person can also increase the danger of temptations which often lead to serious sin. This is no light matter! (Even mature adults have difficulty handling so delicate situations as this and often fail, causing severe repercussions, remorse and extreme moral shame.)

The teen years provide special opportunities to grow in self-knowledge and to the knowledge of others. They are the most opportune time to learn how to have good, clean fun. They are the years when we should develop many interests and building a firm foundation in learning for our adult lives.

Wise teenagers take time to consider the implications of what they are doing with whom.

They share their lives and concerns with parents. They banished the thoughts that their parents will not approve looking at very private, personal struggles because the parents have experienced those same soul searching times. And more importantly have successfully weathered the storm. Let them share your difficult times that you might also weather the difficult storms! They realize that decisions are very important and sometimes very difficult to make. Therefore they take time to think before they act.

And they also take time to pray, asking God for His kind help. Perhaps also speaking to Priests and/or Sisters would help. They have training in many of life's problems that arise in vocations other than their own. Do not take the attitude that they don't know, for they understand better than you who are involved directly in the struggle. They can stand aside; see from a different point of view, what you can't because you are emotionally involved. It takes an intellectual self-disciple to reach the right decisions, in many of the situations people face.

Yes, dating is important, but dating demands decisions based on sound judgment and principles. Give yourself time to develop correctly.
