Visit to the Blessed Sacrament

Do I seek Christ's presence? His companionship everywhere? Is He the King and Center of my Heart?

Is He the beginning; does He have first place in all things with me?

He is present in His Word that I should read and reread; He is present in the liturgy, where others are gathered with me; He is joined with me as food and life in Holy Communion.

He is in the tabernacle in our churches and chapels awaiting my visit in the still hours. Do I seek His presence?

I have been shocked by a spirit of activism in interpreting the spiritual life in our days. I have heard people, sisters, priests, speak critically of too much time spent in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, in the weekly Holy Hour, in private prayer and meditations; speaking critically in the spirit that today action is needed, that time is all too short for these devotions, so they say.

Some also say---see and seek Christ in others always and thereby prove your love for Christ by busying yourself constantly with the welfare and happiness of others.

How, honestly can I continue to have great love for Christ and see Him in others, in the unfortunate, unless I spend time with Him--planning with Him--sometimes just listening and other times conscious of His disapproval.

He is there in the Mass when there is little time for personal private meditation; but He is there also in the tabernacle when I have time to listen to Him and speak with Him.

Have a lively faith and keep a sense of the supernatural. See Christ in all others, yes, but also seek His presence as often as you can in Holy Mass and Holy Communion and in the tabernacle where He awaits your personal visit, where He wants to hear your joy, your sorrow, your problems, your love. Seek Him further in Benediction and in public Holy periods of public veneration of the Blessed Sacrament.

He is always with you, but this lively faith needs the strength that comes from personal association also on your part.

UNITED STATE CONFERENCE OF CATHOLIC BISHOPS - URGENT ACTION ALERT!

It's very important that we respond by September 30th!

In implementing the 2010 Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (the new health care reform law), the US Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) recently issued a rule requiring almost all private health care plans to cover contraception and sterilization as “preventive services” for women. The mandate even forces individual groups with religious or moral objections to purchase and provide such coverage if they are to receive or provide health coverage at all. This poses an unprecedented threat to individual and institutional religious freedom.

Please send an email to HHS by visiting www.usccb.org/conscience. Once you send your comments HHS, you will be automatically invited to send a message to your elected representatives in Congress. Your action is imperative!

Message to HHS: “Pregnancy is not a disease, and drugs and surgeries to prevent it are not basic health care that the government should require all Americans to purchase. Please remove sterilization and prescription contraceptives from the list of ‘preventative services’ the federal government is mandating in private health plans. It is especially important to exclude any drug that may cause an early abortion, and to fully respect religious freedom as other federal laws do. The narrow religious exemption in HHS’s new rule protects almost no one. I urge you to allow all organizations and individuals to offer, sponsor and obtain health coverage that does not violate their moral and religious convictions.”
